BURNHAM HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE ESTABLISHES SCHOLARSHIP FUND TO BENEFIT AREA GRADUATES WHO ATTEND LYCOMING COLLEGE

WILLIAMSPORT, PA – A member of the class of 1950 from Burnham High School is returning some of his good fortune to the community in which he grew up. Daniel Fultz, of Mendon, NY, established a scholarship fund last year. He designated the fund to benefit students who graduate from Indian Valley High School and are accepted as full-time, undergraduate students at Lycoming College, Williamsport, PA.

“Helen and I are pleased to create this new opportunity for promising students from Indian Valley and Lewistown High Schools. We are hopeful that future generations of students from Mifflin County will recognize, and take advantage of the opportunities we experienced during our education at Lycoming,” said Mr. Fultz. “This year’s scholarship will total approximately \$3,200. In future years, we anticipate that the fund will grow, and make awards of approximately \$4,000 each year. Scholarships from this fund honor those who have inspired us along the way.”

Mr. Fultz, who was born and raised in Mifflin County, established the Daniel G. and Helen I. Fultz Scholarship Fund at the Williamsport-Lycoming Community Foundation, founding affiliate of the First Community Foundation of Pennsylvania. Income from the fund will be used to award a scholarship to a graduating senior from Mifflin County. Preference will be given to a graduate of Indian Valley High School. In the event that no student from the school attends Lycoming College in a given year, consideration will be given to a Lewistown High School graduate.

Mr. Fultz began his career at Lycoming College immediately following his graduation from the College in 1957. After eight years at Lycoming, Mr. Fultz accepted a position at Wells College, and then moved to Schlegel Manufacturing Company. In 1989, he retired from Schlegel Manufacturing Company and became Treasurer of Lycoming College. Mr. Fultz remains active with Lycoming College.

Mr. Fultz served on the Board of Directors of the Williamsport-Lycoming Community Foundation from 2001 through 2006. He served a concurrent term on the Board of Directors of the First Community Foundation of Pennsylvania, from 2004 through 2006.
