**SETEBAID SERVICES, INC. RECEIVES GRANT AWARD FROM THE
UNION COUNTY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION; FUNDS WILL HELP UNION
COUNTY CHILDREN LEARN TO MANAGE THEIR DIABETES**

WINFIELD, PA – The Union County Community Foundation recently awarded a \$1,000 grant to Setebaid Services, Inc. in support of its mission of enhancing the quality of life for individuals with diabetes through education. The grant will help Setebaid Services, Inc. provide camperships to children living in Union County.

Setebaid Services, Inc. helps educate young people with diabetes with a series of camps that teach the children skills to maintain their glycemic levels. The camps accept children between the ages of eight and seventeen. According to Setebaid Services, Inc., the Pennsylvania Department of Health, Diabetes Control Program estimates that there are thirteen children in Union County who have diabetes.
